Note from Sue:

So, Ameika and I have been having an ongoing discussion (some would say argument, but we're just both pretty passionate) about what to call the operation formerly known as the HopeMarket. That name came from our original concept as a barter market, but everything has evolved since then and the name has become confusing. I thought we should call it the HopeWorx Community Center. Ameika felt strongly that this would limit us to our specific location, and wanted to call us simply HopeWorx Community. I countered that we are to a certain extent defined by our location, but using the name wouldn't limit us to stay in our building, and besides, no one would know what "HopeWorx Community" means.

For what its worth, this is the argument we've been having since the HopeMarket started. We wanted the barter market to live beyond the walls of HopeWorx, but we found it really difficult to bring people together, except in our location. The community, which was entirely defined by the people who showed up, ended up evolving into more of a social venue- there were still people looking for resources, but many people got the physical resources they needed but kept coming back for the social opportunities around art, music, gardening, cooking and more. We soon found that partnerships were the best way to grow and explore outside our walls – we formed partnerships both formal and informal with gardens, with people seeking entrepreneurial opportunities, with other social service organizations. Our strongest and richest partnership to date has been with Maria Maneos and Brush with the Law – she ran across us on Facebook one day and

messaged us, and before long, we were partnering in so many ways – sharing space, sharing projects, sharing laughs (and tears).

Through these partnerships, we go beyond the walls of HopeWorx, into the world. The name we've settled on is CommunityWorx. I'm going to continue to describe it as a community center, a center for our community to come together, a place where people can feel welcomed, and safe. But, I am sure that Ameika and the community here will continue to leave this home base and spread CommunityWorx throughout Norristown, throughout Montgomery County, and beyond. If you'd like to be a part of our community, just stop by. Maybe you can help us plan our next adventure.

WHAT IS MARTHA'S CHOICE MARKETPLACE?

Martha's Choice Marketplace is a Norristown food pantry that serves anyone living in Montgomery County. We supply clients with essential foods such as non-perishables, dairy, meat and fresh produce, according to family size. Due to Covid, we currently serve clients through a no touch drive through distribution. However, we are working to resume a choice model distribution, as the pandemic begins to subside.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO USE MARTHA'S?

Martha's is available to anyone in need, living in Montgomery County, no questions asked.

WHEN ARE WE OPEN?

We are currently open Wednesdays from 4-6pm, Thursdays from 10am-5pm, and Fridays from 11am-1pm

WHAT ARE THE PANTRY RULES?

1. Clients may come to Martha's one time per month. If you are experiencing a food emergency, we are able to make periodic exceptions, but there are a lot of families needing assistance, and we want to be able to help everyone.

We ask that you please respect the once per month rule.

- 2. **Clean out your car**. We are happy to load the food into your car, but ONLY if there is space. If your car is not clean, you will be asked to exit the parking lot and return when your car is clean enough to load in the groceries. This means you will have to wait in line twice, so please make sure it's clean!
- 3. Walkers: If you walk or Bus to Martha's please bring enough bags to be able take as much food as possible home with you.

COMPLETED MURAL AT MATTIE N. DIXON COMMUNITY CUPBOARD

For the past year, Brush With the Law - Community Service/Re Entry Arts, a community partner of CommunityWorx has been working on an exterior mural for The Mattie N. Dixon Community Cupboard in Ambler. The mural undertaking happened right before the quarantine was announced and BWTL who typically works with people who have community service hours, people on probation and parole, college students, high school students, nonprofits, and community volunteers, was now on their own. Hopeworx

provided the space to paint and along with help from Ameika, and members of CommunityWorx, and the youth group of First Presbyterian Church of Ambler the painting got done. It is now installed on the exterior of the Mattie N. Dixon building located at 150 N. Main St., Ambler, PA.

The Polytab method was used to make this mural which is an indirect way of painting instead of directly on the wall. It also expands opportunities of community inclusion because the fabric is portable and goes anywhere - like jails, and


prisons, or rehabilitation facilities, or schools, literally anywhere without having to worry about weather conditions to paint in. BWTL's artist and director, Maria Maneos created the mural design taking ideas from coloring book pages and clip art. She used Adobe Photoshop to size and organize the images and then sent off to Mural Provisions in Philadelphia to print the design. https://

www.muralprovisions.com/ The installation process of adhering the painted fabric to the walls and applying the anti-graffiti varnish all took place over the month of August; while working on touch ups and hanging panels people driving by would stop and watch, or yell out, "THANK YOU" or "GOOD JOB". The mural illuminates the quaint

neighborhood, and is fun to look at with a kitchen scene, a boutique with clothes on racks, flying tacos, dancing croissants and toast, strings of beads and jewels dangling, welcoming words in both English and Spanish, as well as a little history of the founder, Mattie N. Dixon.

The cupboard was founded by Mattie N. Dixon, a longtime resident of Ambler and a true visionary. In response to learning that people in her community were going hungry, she started serving families out

> of her basement in 1973. As word spread of Mattie's generosity and others joined her efforts, she moved to several other homes for her service, including Zion Baptist Church, Church of the Brethren, and 57 Butler Ave. In 2004, with help from the community and the Ambler Rotary Club, Mrs. Dixon was able to purchase the current

from Montco CSP, First Presbyterian Church of Ambler, Univest Bank, and the PA Council on the Arts this project turned out to be a true community success and job well done.






Stanley said, "I had not bowled in a long time, this is fun". Then, bowled a top score of 81 points while

To celebrate our new and changing community, we kicked things off with a fundraising campaign...our First Annual Dodge Water Balloon Challenge! We ran the event every Friday at HopeWorx. Our goal is to raise money to buy art supplies, work on a community art project and create more opportunities /events for people to get connected to the community both socially and professionally.

100% of the funds raised from the Dodge Water Balloon Challenge will go towards purchasing art supplies for people who would like to do artwork and is unable to come to our location. We will also use the money to support people who would like to participate in different art shows across Montgomery County, PA. Pre-Covid we would host at least three Art and Eat events with over 30 people in attendance at each event. The events allowed people to make their own art and submit to these art shows. In addition, we are able to do some free virtual art classes with Maria Maneos, Founder & Director of the Brush With The Law – Art Program.

Our goal is to raise \$10,000 by June 2022 – we want to be able to put focus on community integration and connections mainly with people living with mental health, Drug and Alcohol, and homelessness challenges.
