Funding cuts, lawsuits, and fear derailed Pennsylvania's plan to close state hospitals and invest in community mental health care

The state's core program to close its psychiatric hospitals and shift care to less-restrictive community programs — the centerpiece of its

legal obligation to people with severe mental illness — has instead been used for the past decade to do the opposite, a Spotlight PA investigation has found.

Created more than 30 years ago, the Community Hospital Integration Project Program, or CHIPP, was designed to get people and dollars out of restrictive and expensive state-

run psychiatric hospitals and into more effective, community-based care.

The money saved by closing hospital beds would be sent to counties. Former state officials told Spotlight PA the local funds were intended to be sacred — a permanent investment in the care promised not only to the people leaving state hospitals, but to future generations who would need it.

CHIPP was never intended to be the full funder of all things, said Sherry Snyder, a former official in the Office of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services.

But it was supposed to be "like the mortar between the bricks," she said.

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Groundbreaking on new behavioral health crisis center

King of Prussia—On Monday, the

Emergency Behavioral Health Crisis
Center that will provide 24-7 crisis
services for adults and children.

Commissioners Chair Neil Makhija said it was the first ever 24-7 behav-

For a time, the program worked.

But since 2015, the state has stopped closing most vacant hospital beds, abandoning a necessary step toward achieving the program's public goal of reducing the need for state mental institutions.

Over the same period of time, new funding for community care dramatically slowed.

ioral health center in the county and would be addressing a long, dire need for adequate and easily accessible crisis care.

The center will use the "No Wrong Door Approach" where trained staff will meet people where they are and provide crisis treatment and comprehensive discharge planning.

"We are going to make sure we serve every resident who comes through these doors and get them the treatment they

need," Makhija said at the November 17th groundbreaking.

Makhija said there is a national crisis in mental health and substance use among adults and youth and only half of those individuals receive the treatment they need. Local, state and federal partners came together to provide the \$21 million for the facility. Deaths by suicide and overdose due to the Opioid crisis are not rare or uncommon. The county was able to obtain \$16 million from funds through Opioid lawsuit settlements. The county contributed \$6 million from the capital budget to make the center possible.

Due to a lack of resources, individuals and families often end up in hospital emergency rooms that are illequipped to handle behavioral health issues. Sometimes people in a crisis land in jail. Makhija cited examples of families seeking help who have waited days in an ER before an intake is made and the situation addressed.

The new center will be located at 1201 West Eighth Avenue, King of Prussia. It is expected to open in December 2026.

Detective Brendan Dougherty of the Upper Merion Township Police is a former crisis intervention specialist and a member of the Montgomery County Veterans Response Team. Representing first responders, he praised the way the county collaborated with law enforcement and first responders.

Matt Miller, of Connections Health Solutions - the organization that will operate the new center - said they were looking forward to partnering with the county as they serve community members in a person-center approach regardless of insurance, demographics or income.

Miller said stabilization is critical and so are comprehensive discharge plans, including housing, transportation and other social services. Connections has served other communities for over 20 years with highly trained, multi-disciplinary teams that result in higher and faster success rates.

Subcommittee Reports from October 2025

Advocacy Subcommittee: Topic: Advocacy Flyer CSP Stories –

Cindy presented information about CSP Stories Flyer. Scan QR code and they can email their story about how the budget cuts affect their lives. Once we get messages, compile stories, and who we will share the stories with. Open to suggestions. Christine suggested to reach to Robin Stelly and ask her to next meeting. SEPTA cuts, Medicaid cuts how they affect access to care. Flyer has been emailed to the advocacy committee members. Advocates will share with others. Send flyer to Central and other providers to post in physical spaces. Post on Facebook. Email: CSPstories@hopeworxinc.org.

Topic: Advocacy - Assisted Outpatient Treatment (AOT) – Someone could go to the court and ask to have someone court-ordered to outpatient treatment. In recent years, it's become more popular across the state. Every year since approved by the state, CSP writes a letter opposing AOT that forces people into treatment. Letter is sent to the Montgomery County Commissioners. Tracey suggested personal examples of what could happen if AOT approved.

MOTION approved: Committee agreed to send the AOT letter to the commissioners this year.

Topic: Advocacy - Election information – Information in this month's newsletter. You can still register to vote until Oct. 20th. The last day to apply for absentee ballot is Oct. 28th. Voting: Montco has satellite offices at 6 different around county. On weekends until election, you can get help with voting. Online: www.montgomerycountypavoterservices.org. Get sample ballot there. No federal offices up for election. PA statewide races are for judges. Every 10 years we vote to retain them or not. Where Sue lives, her borough council is up for election. Other areas have school board races. These local elected officials affect our lives directly.

Topic: Advocacy - New Work Requirements - Tracey said work required, doctor's sign off. Val Arkoosh put together a website www.dhs.pa.gov/work. SNAP with requirements has taken effect. More strict. Medicaid changes are coming. Sue said if you're on disability, that won't change. Open your mail and make sure your address is updated with the post office to stay informed.

Community Outreach Subcommittee: Still looking for ideas.

Conference Subcommittee: Justin will look for some potential venues. Variety Club got back. Harry will arrange a meet up time with them to tour facility. Looking at different food options. Harry said the farm is too expensive. Tents \$4,200 and traffic control \$2,000. We'll save \$6,200 going to another venue.


